1. MOOC OBJECTIVE

- Training for legal practitioners aiming to spread knowledge of disability rights and awareness of issues to take into consideration when protecting, promoting and fulfilling such rights through day-to-day legal activities
- Course designed based on an analysis of the barriers that persons with disabilities face in accessing justice, at times related with gaps in the training of legal operators.
- Against this backdrop, the specific objective of the course is to contribute to bridging these gaps in the conviction that this will achieve a more effective guarantee of access to justice for persons with disabilities.



2. MULTILANGUAGE AND ACCESIBLE PLATFORM



- The course will be accessible through the E-learning platform of Thomson Reuters Aranzadi.
- The course will support accessible fomats in order to comply with the WAI-AA.
- The languages of the course are English, Spanish and French. Besides, the course is also accessible in Easy Read.

- Open access online course platform aimed at large-scale interactive participation,
